**Proceedings of the 29<sup>th</sup> meeting of State Level Coordination Committee on Crop Insurance held on 25.11.2011 at 4.00 PM under the Chairmanship of Agriculture Production Commissioner, Orissa**

The 29<sup>th</sup> meeting of the State Level Coordination Committee on Crop Insurance (SLCCCI) was held on 25.11.2011 under the Chairmanship of Agriculture Production Commissioner, Orissa.

The names of Officers/Members present at the meeting are indicated in Annexure-I.

At the outset, the Registrar of Cooperative Societies, Orissa welcomed the participants and initiated the discussion as per the agenda:

**1: Confirmation of the proceedings of the 28<sup>th</sup> meeting of SLCCCI and Compliance there of**

The proceedings of the 28<sup>th</sup> meeting of SLCCCI communicated to all the members vide L. No. 11840 dated 9.6.2011 of RCS(O) were confirmed.

The RCS(O) placed the Action Taken Report on the proceedings of the 28<sup>th</sup> meeting of the SLCCCI for review. The following observations were made.

- i. The Govt. of India should be persued for consideration of relaxation of mandatory 16 CCEs.
- ii. The RBI and SLBC would issue appropriate instructions to defaulting Banks for meticulous adherence to NAIS.
- iii. The APC emphasized the need for adequate training at the district level for RIs to facilitate smooth conduct of CCEs.

**2: Consideration of the recommendations of the SLTC for Rabi-2011-12**

The recommendations of the State Level Technical Committee were discussed and the following decisions were taken for implementation during Rabi 2011-12.

**(A) National Agricultural Insurance Scheme**

- i.) Crops to be covered- Paddy, Groundnut, Mustard & Potato.
- ii) Unit area of Insurance-

Paddy	Gram Panchayat
Groundnut, Mustard & Potato	District/ Cluster of District

## iii) Areas to be notified -

- (a) Paddy- Selected GPs of 28 Districts (except Balasore & Bhadrak) would be covered under NAIS. MNAIS would be implemented in Balasore and Bhadrak with GP as unit of Insurance.
- (b) Groundnut-The following 20 Districts would be covered during Rabi 2011-12.

It was decided to club the districts as follows for the purpose of conducting CCEs in the interest of the farmers.

- i. Malkangiri with Nowrangpur
  - ii. Sambalpur with Baragarh.
  - iii. Sundargarh and Deogarh
  - iv. Bhadrak with Balasore
- (c) Mustard- The following 11 Districts would be covered during Rabi 2011-12.

- (d) Potato- The following 18 Districts would be covered during Rabi 2011- 12 season.

The APC advised the Principal Secretary, Agriculture to take up a meeting with the DE&S and DA&FP to sort out the problems relating to coverage of area and availability of yield data.

iv. Premium rates and indemnity levels-

Premium rates, indemnity levels for Rabi 2011-12 season were decided as follows:

v. Subsidy on premium – For small & marginal farmers (having land holding of 2 Hectare or less) the premium subsidy would be 10% of gross premium in Rabi 2011-12.

vi. Seasonality discipline- the seasonality discipline for loanee and non- loanee farmers would be as follows-

a) Loanee Farmers:-

b) Non-Loanee Farmers:-

i. The cut-off date for joining the scheme by Non-Loanee farmers is 31<sup>st</sup> of December, 2011 or one month from the date of sowing of insured crop whichever is earlier. The nodal banks have to submit the declaration and premium to AIC of India by 31<sup>st</sup> of January, 2012.

ii. The Cut off date for submission of Actual Yield Data and area under production for notified units, districts /state average yield data for paddy, Groundnut, Mustard & Potato would be 16<sup>th</sup> August, 2012. The Cooperation Department would furnish the crop yield estimates to the Implementing Agency as per cutoff date. While furnishing the yield data, the Cooperation Department will certify that the said crop yield data are based on single series as per the scheme provisions. The Director of Economics & Statistics would arrange for submission of yield data well before the cut-off date to the Cooperation Department.

iii. The DE&S informed that the yield data in respect of Rabi 2010-11 were not received from two GPs of Puri Districts and one GP and one NAC of Boudh District. It was decided to advise the concerned Collectors to take action against the defaulting RIs.

iv. It was decided to move GOI for calculation of claims in respect of paddy using yield data of Blocks wherever GP level data are not available.

**B) Modified National Agricultural Insurance Scheme**

Govt. have decided to implement the pilot scheme during Rabi 2011-12 in two Districts namely, Balasore & Bhadrak for paddy crop . Under this scheme Gram Panchayat would be the Unit of insurance for paddy crop.

The Committee, after due deliberation, accepted the proposal of SLTC for implementation of MNAIS in two districts namely Balasore & Bhadrak. Four Companies namely AIC of India Ltd., ICICI Lombard GIC Ltd., HDFC ERGO GIC Ltd., IFFCO TOKIO GIC Ltd. were allowed to participate in this scheme as per the details given below.
